

### PARLI SLAM AND JAM

Cat Shuman, Past President/Parliamentarian

### Questions:

When are email or telephone votes okay?

What can be done if we do not have a quorum for a general meeting?

#### Answers:

According to Robert's Rules of Order, email or telephone votes are only allowed if authority to do so is provided in the organization's bylaws. In our chapter, we have used email "votes" on a few rare occasions when an answer was required prior to the next general meeting and it did not involve spending money. Those would be considered "polling votes" rather than actual votes to be recorded into the minutes.

If our chapter does not have a quorum at a meeting, here are the things we are allowed to do per Robert's Rules of Order:

- o Set a time to adjourn and reschedule the meeting prior to the next regular meeting
- o Adjourn
- o Recess
- o Take measures to obtain a quorum
- o If business is not urgent, those present could continue to meet. Any actions that are approved would have to be ratified at a later meeting with a quorum. The group becomes responsible (liable) for any actions taken without a quorum those actions become null and void if not ratified.

Our chapter would probably continue a meeting without a quorum in hopes of finding another member to show up so that business can be conducted. If we were to include an allowance in our bylaws to conduct email votes, this would provide a legal way to ratify any actions taken at a meeting without a quorum. I would recommend that we look at including such a provision in our bylaws and will add this to the discussion list for the chapter bylaw review on August 31.

Women of Today Week will be celebrated September 24  $th-30\,th$ . At Sept general meeting I will be handing out my plans for the week. But remember, it's ALWAYS a good time to mention Monticello Women of Today no matter where you are.




## Mentor Moment


