

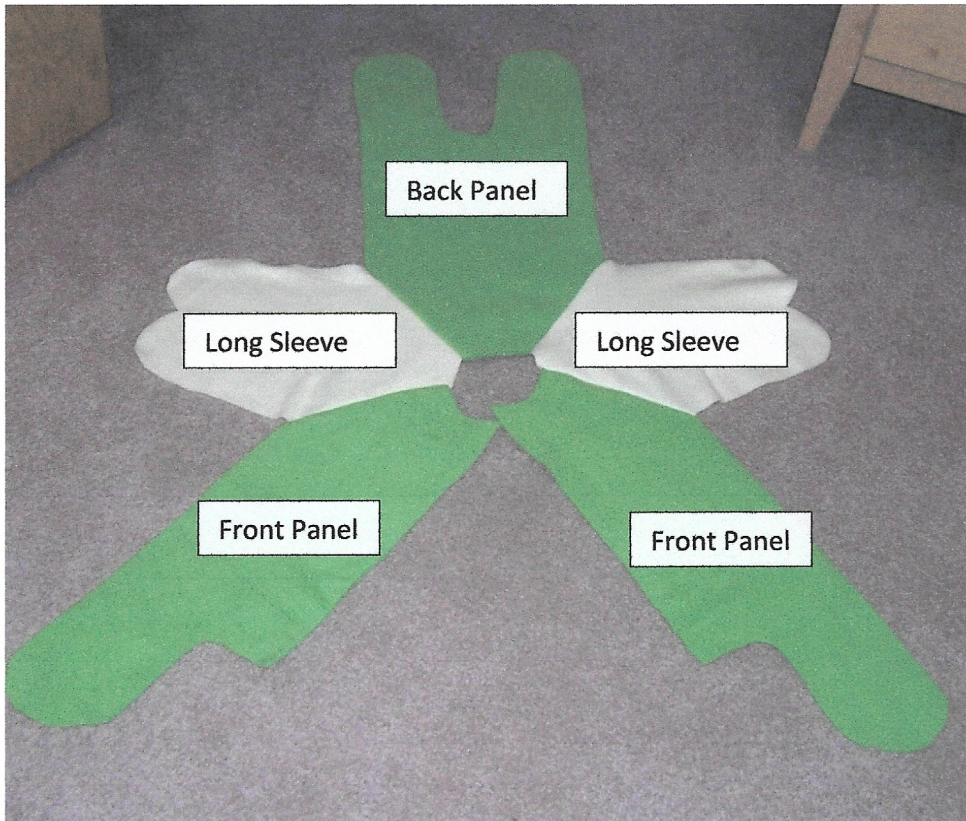
BUNTING Directions

Disclaimer: These instructions are guidelines. There may be alternate sewing methods.

Items in Bunting Kit:

Two front panels, one back panel, two sleeves, one hood,

NOTE: Buntings are usually made from polar fleece. Always use the bunting hood pattern. The jacket hood looks similar but is slightly different in size.

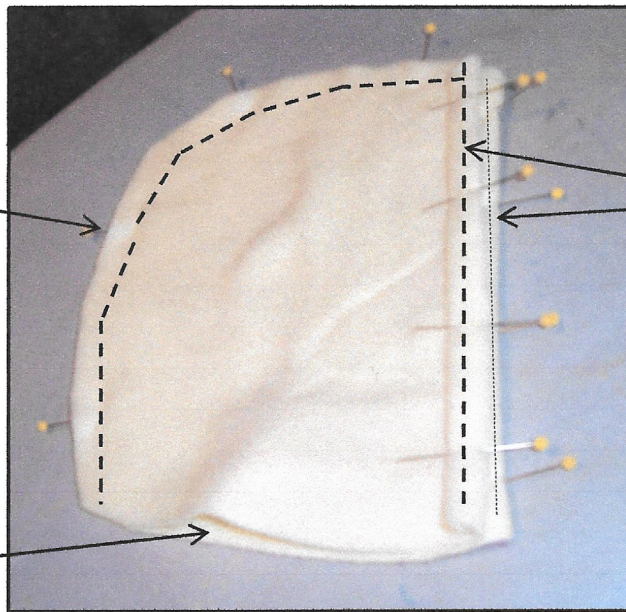


Sew right sides together for
body front, back and
sleeves.

Sew hood right sides together.

Sew hem into each hood side along the face.

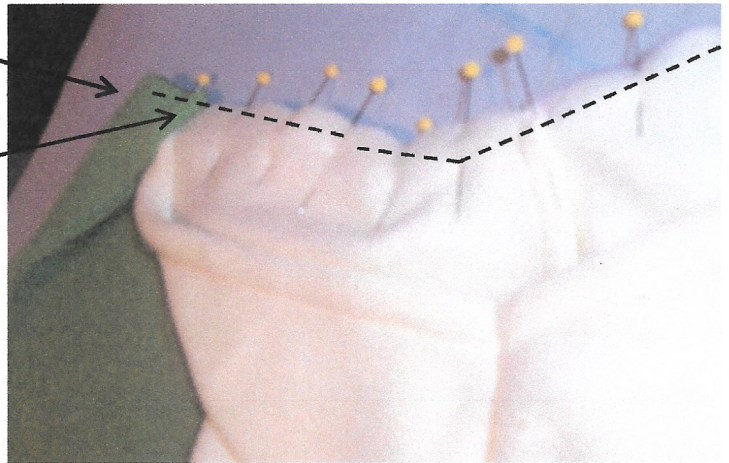
Leave bottom open to attach to bunting neck later



Fold front lapel back approximately $\frac{3}{4}$ " with right sides together. Capture the hood edge in the lapel. Repeat this step on the other end of the front lapel.

Set hood slightly back from the lapel fold. This allows baby chin space later when snap closures are attached.

Sew right side of hood to right side of bunting body

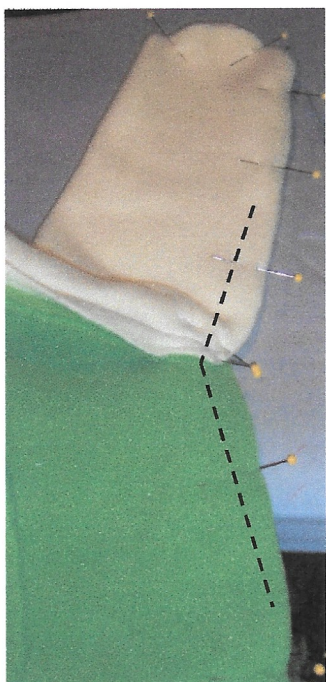


Finished hood.
Front lapel corner is turned right side out and hood is slightly set back from the corner

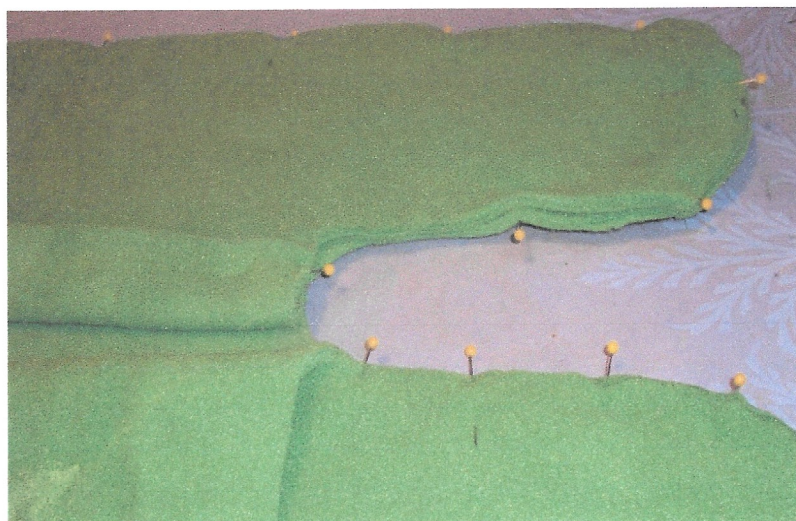
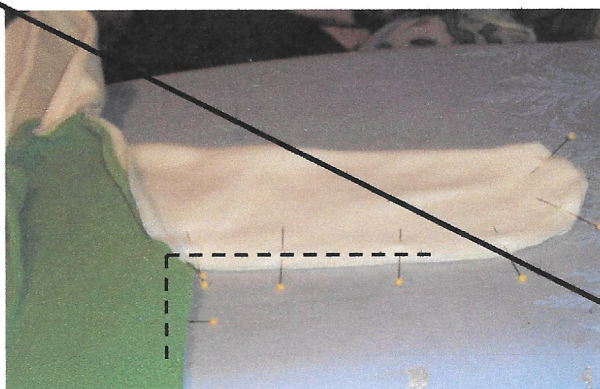


Sew sleeves and body of bunting.

To avoid armpit puckers,
Sew sleeve and body seam
as vertical as possible

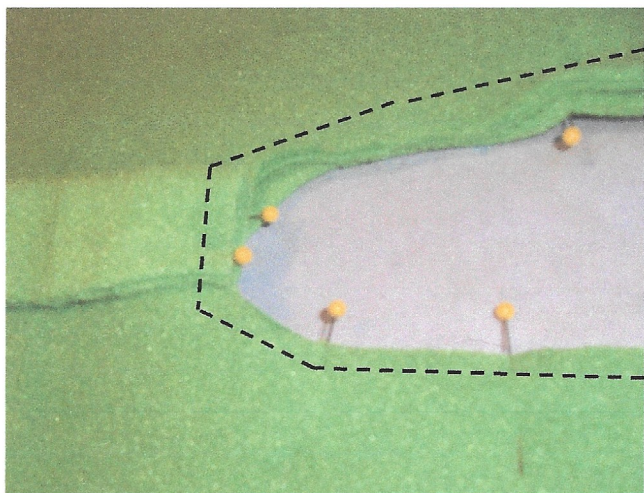


Don't sew arm seam too angular –
this causes puckers under the arm.



Crotch Step 1 - Fold one front lapel
back, approximately 1".
This creates the crotch and label.

It doesn't matter if the is finished
with right lapel over left or left over
right.



Crotch Step 2 – Fold second lapel back, insides together, and position it over the first lapel fold.

This will sew both lapel folds, one on top of the other and into the crotch seam. This makes the front placket. Finish lapel may be either right over left or left over right

The front will later be closed with snaps.
